

Derek Evans Class of 2001

Owner and Proprietor of *Project 615*

This issue's *Featured Cardinal* is Derek Evans. Derek graduated from Southport in 2001. After his time at SHS, he attended college at Anderson University and studied broadcast journalism, graduating in 2005.

In 2008, Derek moved to Nashville, Tennessee. Hoping to work in the music industry, he began creating t-shirts and merchandise for musicians and bands.

Shortly after his move to Nashville, Derek started his company, Project 615. Project 615 is a tshirt and apparel company based out of Nashville, TN. They are not your average company. Project 615 is mission minded. Derek and his crew regularly employ those who are recovering from homelessness to serve in their production department. Derek found inspiration after a mission trip to LA in 2010 to serve the homeless on Skid Row (a very large homeless population in downtown LA). At that point, Derek decided he wanted to do something about it back where he lived in Nashville. Since the company's inception in 2010, Project 615 has consistently donated a portion of their profits to a local homeless outreach shelter in Nashville called Set Free. It was then that Derek realized, "most of those who lived at the homeless shelter needed employment. So in 2012, we began hiring from Set Free. We have since employed 38 people from Set Free."
