Each May, SHSAA holds a banquet during which we award deserving seniors with money to further their education or chosen vocational aspirations. These scholarships come from the donations made by groups or individuals that want to support SHS students. We routinely award over \$65,000 to more than 60 students. This is an amazing accomplishment for a public, suburban high school.

The cost of the banquet itself is over \$10,000 and is funded by people such as yourself who want to help, but may not be able or interested in funding a scholarship. SHS Graduate Miller Inducted into Hall of Fame



Robin Miller has been named by the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association as a member of its Hall of Fame Class of 2019.

Miller got his start with Jim Hurtubise at the 1968 Indianapolis 500. Soon after, he started working at The Indianapolis Star. Robin also worked on television with ESPN when he was hired to write and cover IndyCar for RPM2Night, and was a

favorite guest and guest host on SPEED's "Wind Tunnel" and SPEED REPORT. In a radio interview on 1070 The Fan, Robin spoke with host JMV and said, "I was really lucky. I'm covering the Indiana Pacers when I'm 19 years old and the Indianapolis 500 when I'm 19 years old, that probably couldn't happen anymore. You certainly couldn't get a job at the [Indy] Star or any paper unless you had a college degree, you'd never even get an interview. All the planets lined up for me, I was just very, very lucky."


