

The purpose of this award is to recognize SHS graduates who since graduation have demonstrated high level of achievement in their field of endeavor and/or who have made significant contributions through achievement, service, or leadership to the community.

Guidelines: Nominations must be made through the Google Form by March 1, 2020. To be considered for recognition, the individual must have graduated at least 25 years prior to the recognition and meet the criteria for recognition as stated in the purpose.

Individuals not selected the first year of nomination are automatically reconsidered with the next group and will remain in consideration for the next 10 years. Nominations older than 10 years must be resubmitted. Recipients of the award must be able to attend the Alumni Scholarship banquet on Monday, May 18, 2020 at the SHS Fieldhouse.





Featured Cardinal





Dr. Wayne PerkinsClass of 1955

Professor at Evansville University

This issue's *Featured Cardinal* is Wayne Perkins. Wayne, a professor emeritus of religion and ordained elder in the United Methodist Church, earned his undergraduate degree at Asbury College, magna cum laude, and an STB, summa cum laude, and PhD at Boston University. He started at the University of Evansville in 1966 as a faculty member in the Department of Philosophy and Religion. During his tenure at UE, Wayne served as director of religious life, University chaplain, and chair of the department. He also taught World Religions and Religious Perspectives for many years in the Adult Education program at UE.

Dr. Perkins was professor and mentor to thousands of UE students over five decades. He advised countless students in their academic achievements, but more than that, Perkins directed students in their ministry and vocational goals, too. Dr. Perkins initiated conversations with students about liberation theology, which stirred the souls of young people to speak truth to power, to stand up for the oppressed, and to be voices of courage.

The annual R. Wayne Perkins Lecture Series names Dr. Perkins' teaching and advising legacy, and honors his contribution to scholarship, the University of Evansville, The United Methodist Church, and the lives of students for over 50 years. The lecture series, sponsored by the Office of Religious Life of the University of Evansville, brings together religion scholars, theologians, and church leaders to explore biblical and theological questions relevant to our common life together. The lectures are intended to be public in nature, engage a broad gathering of world views, and help inform the complexities of theological understanding within contemporary life.

Wayne is married to Sally Perkins '77 who earned a master's degree at the University of Evansville. They have three grown children and five grandchildren.




The group is looking for seniors from each class of Coach Braden's tenure (1955-1969) to serve as representatives of their class. Responsibilities would be:
